1. General Information

KBCDA Community Energy Holdings Ltd is a company limited by shares incorporated and registered in Ireland. The registered number of the company is 693330. The registered office of the company is Kilanerin Community Centre, Gorey, Wexford which is also the principal place of business of the company. KBCDA Community Energy Holdings Ltd is a parent company of seven companies, these subsidiaries have been set up as applications for Solar Farms have been made through these entities.

KBCDA Community Energy Holdings Ltd is itself a 100% subsidiary of Kilanerin Ballyfad Community Development Association CLG. The financial statements have been presented in Euro (€) which is also the functional currency of the company.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

The following accounting policies have been applied consistently in dealing with items which are considered material in relation to the company's financial statements.

Statement of compliance

The financial statements of the company for the financial year ended 31 March 2025 have been prepared on the going concern basis and in accordance with FRS 102 "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland" (FRS 102).

Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared on the going concern basis and in accordance with the historical cost convention except for certain properties and financial instruments that are measured at revalued amounts or fair values, as explained in the accounting policies below. Historical cost is generally based on the fair value of the consideration given in exchange for assets. The financial reporting framework that has been applied in their preparation is the Companies Act 2014 and FRS 102 "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland" issued by the Financial Reporting Council.

The company qualifies as a small company as defined by section 280B of the Companies Act 2014 in respect of the financial year, and has applied the rules of the 'Small Companies Regime' in accordance with section 280C of the Companies Act 2014.

Cash flow statement

The company has availed of the exemption in FRS 102 from the requirement to prepare a Statement of Cash Flows because it is classified as a small company.

Trade and other creditors

Trade and other creditors are initially recognised at fair value and thereafter stated at amortised cost using the effective interest rate method, unless the effect of discounting would be immaterial, in which case they are stated at cost.

Employee benefits

The company does not currently have employees and therefore no employee benefits exist.

Taxation and deferred taxation

Current tax represents the amount expected to be paid or recovered in respect of taxable profits for the financial year and is calculated using the tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantially enacted at the Balance Sheet date.

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed at the balance sheet date where transactions or events have occurred at that date that will result in an obligation to pay more tax in the future, or a right to pay less tax in the future. Timing differences are temporary differences between the company's taxable profits and its results as stated in the financial statements.

Deferred tax is measured on an undiscounted basis at the tax rates that are anticipated to apply in the periods in which the timing differences are expected to reverse, based on tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the Balance Sheet date.

Foreign currencies

Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are translated at the rates of exchange ruling at the Balance Sheet date. Non-monetary items that are measured in terms of historical cost in a foreign currency are translated at the rates of exchange ruling at the date of the transaction. Non-monetary items that are measured at fair value in a foreign currency are translated using the exchange rates at the date when the fair value was determined. The resulting exchange differences are dealt with in the Profit and Loss Account.

9. Related party transactions

KBCDA Community Energy Holdings Ltd received €1100 from its parent company Kilanerin -Ballyfad Community development Association CLG. At 31.03.2025 initial works, professional fees and grid application fees for the 7 subsidiaries amounted to €402,993. These amounts have been paid by a companies connected to a director Peter Kavanagh. Peter Kavanagh has confirmed that these costs are only repayable if one or more of the solar projects in the KBCDA CEH becomes operational.

At 31.03.25 €1100 is owed to its parent company. these funds were used to pay initial set up costs of companies.

At 31.03.25 €3,008 is owed to Peter Kavanagh & his associated companies MCF, balance has reduced from €8093 in the previous year.

100% subsidiary, costs to 31.03.25 amount to €33,929,(31.03.24 €33,929) but are treated as a contingent liability as per note on trade with group companies and contingent liability note.

Barnland Community Solar Farm Ltd

100% subsidiary, costs to 31.03.25 amount to €28,022 (31.03.24 €28,022), but are treated as a contingent liability as per note on trade with group companies and contingent liability note.

Clashganny Community Solar Ltd

49% subsidiary, costs to 31.03.25 amount to €70,952 (31.03.24 €70,952) but are treated as a contingent liability as per note on trade with group companies and contingent liability note.

Amberhill Community Solar Ltd

49% subsidiary, costs to 31.03.25 amount to €94,190 (31.03.24 €94,190), but are treated as a contingent liability as per note on trade with group companies and contingent liability note.

Derrynahinch Community Solar Ltd

49% subsidiary, costs to 31.03.25 amount to €108,161 (31.03.24 €108,161) but are treated as a contingent liability as per note on trade with group companies and contingent liability note.

Graigue Beg Community Solar Ltd

49% subsidiary, this company owns 100% of Graigue Beg Community Renewables Ltd, the costs to 31.03.25 €56,929 (31.03.24 €56,929) have been incurred in this company. These are treated as a contingent liability as per note on trade with group companies and contingent liability note.
