### **Opinion**

In our opinion the directors are entitled under section 352 of the Companies Act 2014 to annex the abridged financial statements to the annual return of Bridge Street Taverns Limited ('the company') and those abridged financial statements have been properly prepared pursuant to the provisions of section 353 of that Act (exemptions available to small companies).

### **Basis of opinion**

We have examined :

- (i) the abridged financial statements for the financial year ended 31 December 2025 on pages 8 to 12 which the directors of Bridge Street Taverns Limited propose to annex to the annual return of the company; and



## NOTES TO THE ABRIDGED FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

for the financial year ended 31 December 2025

### 1. General Information

Bridge Street Taverns Limited is a company limited by shares incorporated and registered in Ireland. The registered number of the company is 693832. The registered office of the company is BCA Tax & Business Consultants Limited, Clonminch Hi-Technology Park, Clonminch, Tullamore, Co. Offaly, R35A2Y4. The principal activity of the company is to operate and manage the public house known as The Brazen Head, 20 Lower Bridge street, Ushers Quay, Dublin 8. The financial statements have been presented in Euro (€) which is also the functional currency of the company.

### 2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

The following accounting policies have been applied consistently in dealing with items which are considered material in relation to the company's financial statements.

#### Statement of compliance

The financial statements of the company for the financial year ended 31 December 2025 have been prepared in accordance with the provisions of FRS 102 Section 1A (Small Entities) and the Companies Act 2014.

#### Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared on the going concern basis and in accordance with the historical cost convention except for certain properties and financial instruments that are measured at revalued amounts or fair values, as explained in the accounting policies below. Historical cost is generally based on the fair value of the consideration given in exchange for assets. The financial reporting framework that has been applied in their preparation is the Companies Act 2014 and FRS 102 "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland" Section 1A, issued by the Financial Reporting Council.

The company qualifies as a small company as defined by section 280A of the Companies Act 2014 in respect of the financial year, and has applied the rules of the 'Small Companies Regime' in accordance with section 280C of the Companies Act 2014 and Section 1A of FRS 102.

#### Turnover

Turnover is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable, exclusive of trade discounts, rebates, value added tax and other sales taxes.

#### Tangible assets and depreciation

Tangible assets are stated at cost or at valuation, less accumulated depreciation. The charge to depreciation is calculated to write off the original cost or valuation of tangible assets, less their estimated residual value, over their expected useful lives as follows:

Fixtures, fittings and equipment	- 33% Straight line
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The carrying values of tangible fixed assets are reviewed annually for impairment in periods if events or changes in circumstances indicate the carrying value may not be recoverable.

#### Stocks

Stocks are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Stocks are determined on a first-in first-out basis. Cost comprises expenditure incurred in the normal course of business in bringing stocks to their present location and condition. Full provision is made for obsolete and slow moving items. Net realisable value comprises actual or estimated selling price (net of trade discounts) less all further costs to completion or to be incurred in marketing and selling.

#### Trade and other debtors

Trade and other debtors are initially recognised at fair value and thereafter stated at amortised cost using the effective interest method less impairment losses for bad and doubtful debts except where the effect of discounting would be immaterial. In such cases the receivables are stated at cost less impairment losses for bad and doubtful debts.

#### Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprise cash at bank and in hand, demand deposits with banks and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less and bank overdrafts. In the Balance Sheet bank overdrafts are shown within Creditors.

### Trade and other creditors

Trade and other creditors are initially recognised at fair value and thereafter stated at amortised cost using the effective interest rate method, unless the effect of discounting would be immaterial, in which case they are stated at cost.

### Taxation

Current tax represents the amount expected to be paid or recovered in respect of taxable profits for the financial year and is calculated using the tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantially enacted at the Balance Sheet date.

### Foreign currencies

Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are translated at the rates of exchange ruling at the Balance Sheet date. Non-monetary items that are measured in terms of historical cost in a foreign currency are translated at the rates of exchange ruling at the date of the transaction. Non-monetary items that are measured at fair value in a foreign currency are translated using the exchange rates at the date when the fair value was determined. The resulting exchange differences are dealt with in the Profit and Loss Account.

### Ordinary share capital

The ordinary share capital of the company is presented as equity.

### Exceptional item

Exceptional items are those that the directors' view are required to be separately disclosed by virtue of their size or incidence to enable a full understanding of the company's financial performance.

### 3. Provisions Available for Audits of Small Entities

In common with many other businesses of our size and nature, we use our auditors to prepare and submit tax returns to the Revenue, to provide company secretarial services and to assist with the preparation of the financial statements.

working capital funding of €100,000 to Perfect Pubs 5 Limited. Subsequently, during the financial year ended 31 December 2025, the outstanding loan balance due from Perfect Pubs 5 Limited was formally written off by Bridge Street Taverns Limited. Following this write-off, no amounts remains recoverable in respect of this loan.

Eoin Doyle and Ray Byrne are directors/shareholders of Bridge Street Taverns Limited and directors/beneficial owners of Hotel Opportunities Limited. During the year, Hotel Opportunities Limited provided management services in the amount of €287,150 (2024: €246,334) to Bridge Street Taverns Limited. The balance owed to Hotel Opportunities Limited from Bridge Street Taverns Limited at year end is €72,783 (2024: €60,599). This amount is included in trade creditors at year end.

**13. Controlling interest**

The directors Eoin Doyle and Ray Byrne are the ultimate controlling parties of the company who each control 50% of the issued ordinary share capital.

**14. Post-Balance Sheet Events**

There have been no significant events affecting the company since the financial year-end.

**15. Financial Commitments**

Bridge Street Taverns limited has entered a 5 year lease for the premises known as The Brazen Head Inn from 28 May 2021. The annual rental charge is determined by the net operating profit in the period.

**16. Approval of financial statements**

The financial statements were approved and authorised for issue by the board of directors on 26 February 2026.
