DIRECTORS' REPORT for the year ended 31 December 2022

The directors present herewith their report and audited Financial Statements ("financial statements") for the year ended 31 December 2022. Canouan Utilities Limited ("the Company") qualifies as a small company in accordance with Section 280A of the Companies Act 2014 and this report has been prepared in accordance with the small companies' regime.

PRINCIPAL ACTIVITIES, REVIEW OF THE BUSINESS AND FUTURE DEVELOPMENTS

The principal activity of the Company is to manage the utilities for a real estate project held within the same group of companies.

The Statement of Comprehensive Income for the year ended 31 December 2022 and the Statement of Financial Position at that date are set out on pages 8 and 9. The profit on ordinary activities for the year before taxation was \$14,525 (2021 restated: \$38,370 profit).

PRINCIPAL RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The principal risks and uncertainties which the Company faces are:

- The Company is dependent on the performance of the groups real estate assets. A lack of performance for the groups real estate assets could be detrimental to the ability of the Company to continue in operation.

The Company has business policies and organisational structures to limit these risks and uncertainties. The board of directors and management regularly review, reassess and proactively limit the associated risks.

DIRECTORS' RESPONSIBILITIES STATEMENT

The directors are responsible for preparing the directors' report and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and regulations.

Irish company law requires the directors to prepare financial statements for each financial year. Under the law the directors have elected to prepare the financial statements in accordance with the Companies Act 2014 and FRS 102 "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland" issued by the Financial Reporting Council. Under company law, the directors must not approve the financial statements unless they are satisfied that they give a true and fair view of the assets, liabilities and financial position of the Company as at the financial year end date and of the profit or loss of the Company for the financial year and otherwise comply with the Companies Act 2014.

In preparing those financial statements, the directors are required to;

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- state whether the financial statements have been prepared in accordance with applicable accounting standards and identify the standards in question, subject to any material departures from those standards being disclosed and explained in the notes to the financial statements; and
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the Company will continue in business.

The directors are responsible for ensuring that the Company keeps or causes to be kept adequate accounting records which correctly explain and record the transactions of the Company, enable at any time the assets, liabilities, financial position and profit or loss of the Company to be determined with reasonable accuracy; and enable them to ensure that the financial statements and directors' report comply with the Companies Act 2014 and enable those financial statements to be audited.

They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the Company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT

The Company did not engage in any research and development activities during the financial period.

Report on the audit of the financial statements

Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of Canouan Utilities Limited ('the Company') for the year ended 31 December 2022 which comprise the Statement of Comprehensive Income, the Statement of Financial Position, the Statement of Changes in Equity and the related notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies set out in note 2. The financial reporting framework that has been applied in their preparation is Irish Law and FRS 102 "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland".

In our opinion the financial statements:

- give a true and fair view of the assets, liabilities and financial position of the Company as at 31 December 2022 and of its profit for the year then ended;
- have been properly prepared in accordance with FRS 102 "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland"; and
- have been properly prepared in accordance with the requirements of the Companies Act 2014.

Basis for opinion

**NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS
for the year ended 31 December 2022****1 GENERAL INFORMATION**

These financial statements comprising the Statement of Comprehensive income, the Statement of Financial Position, the Statement of Changes in Equity and the related notes constitute the individual financial statements of Canouan Utilities Limited for the financial year ended 31 December 2022.

2 ACCOUNTING POLICIES*(a) Basis of preparation*

The financial statements have been prepared on the going concern basis and in accordance with the historical cost convention unless otherwise specified within these accounting policies and in accordance with Section 1A of Financial Reporting Standard 102, the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and the Republic of Ireland and the Companies Act 2014.

These financial statements present information about the Company as an individual undertaking and not about its group. In accordance with the exemption granted by Section 303 3(b) of the Companies Act 2014, the Company does not prepare consolidated financial statements as the information needed to prepare consolidated financial statements cannot be obtained without disproportionate expense or undue delay. As a result, these accounts present information relating to the Company as an individual undertaking and do not contain consolidated financial information in relation to the group.

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with FRS 102 requires the use of certain critical accounting estimates. It also requires management to exercise its judgment in the process of applying the Company's accounting policies. The areas involving a higher degree of judgment or complexity, or areas where assumptions and estimates are significant to the financial statements are disclosed in note 2(b).

The Company has availed of the exemption in FRS 102 7.1B from including a cash flow statement in the financial statements on the grounds that the Company is small.

The functional and presentation currency of the Company is United States Dollars (\$).

(b) Judgments and key sources of estimation uncertainty

The preparation of financial statements requires management to make judgments, estimates and assumptions that affect the amounts reported for assets and liabilities as at the Statement of Financial Position date and the amounts reported for revenues and expenses during the period. However, the nature of estimation means that actual outcomes could differ from those estimates.

There are no significant judgements or sources of estimation uncertainty in the financial statements.

(c) Recoverability of amounts owed by group undertakings

Amounts due from related parties represents a significant portion of total assets. The Directors regularly review the financial position of each related party at the year end. If there is a reasonable doubt about a related parties ability to repay the balance, a provision is made against the loan and is charged to the Profit and Loss account in the period in which it is recognised.

(d) Financial assets

Basic financial assets, including trade and other receivables, cash and bank balances and investments in loans, are initially recognised at transaction price, unless the arrangement constitutes a financing transaction, where the transaction is measured at the present value of the future receipts discounted at a market rate of interest. Such assets are subsequently carried at amortised cost using the effective interest method.

At the end of each reporting period financial assets measured at amortised cost are assessed for objective evidence of impairment. If an asset is impaired the impairment loss is the difference between the carrying amount and the present value of the estimated cash flows discounted at the asset's original effective interest rate. The impairment loss is recognised in profit or loss.

If there is decrease in the impairment loss arising from an event occurring after the impairment was recognised, the impairment is reversed. The reversal is such that the current carrying amount does not exceed what the carrying amount would have been had the impairment not previously been recognised. The impairment reversal is recognised in profit or loss.

Other financial assets, including investments in equity instruments which are not subsidiaries, associates or joint ventures, are initially measured at fair value, which is normally the transaction price. Such assets are subsequently carried at fair value and the changes in fair value are recognised in profit or loss, except that investments in equity instruments that are not publicly traded and whose fair values cannot be measured reliably are measured at cost less impairment.

Financial assets are derecognised when (a) the contractual rights to the cash flows from the asset expire or are settled, or (b) substantially all the risks and rewards of the ownership of the asset are transferred to another party or (c) despite having retained some significant risks and rewards of ownership, control of the asset has been transferred to another party who has the practical ability to unilaterally sell the asset to an unrelated third party without imposing additional restrictions.

(e) Cash at bank and in hand

Cash at bank and in hand includes cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

(f) Foreign currency translation

Items included in the financial statements of the Company are measured using the currency of the primary economic environment in which the Company operates ('the functional currency'). The financial statements are presented in US dollars (\$), which is also the Company's functional currency.

Foreign currency transactions are translated into the functional currency using the exchange rates prevailing at the dates of the transactions or valuation where items are re-measured. Foreign exchange gains and losses resulting from the settlement of such transactions and from the translation at year end exchange rates of monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are recognised in the Statement of Comprehensive Income.

(g) Taxation

The tax expense for the financial period comprises current and deferred tax. Current tax is charged or credited to other comprehensive income if it relates to items that are charged or credited to other comprehensive income. Similarly, current tax is charged or credited to equity if it relates to items that are credited or charged directly to equity. Otherwise income tax is recognised in the Statement of Comprehensive Income. Current tax is provided at amounts expected to be paid (or recovered) using the tax rates and laws that have been enacted for the financial year.

Deferred tax is recognised on all temporary differences arising between the tax bases of assets and liabilities and their carrying amounts in the financial statements, except for deferred tax assets which are only recognised to the extent that it is probable that taxable profit will be available against which the deductible temporary differences, carried forward tax credits or tax losses can be utilised.

Deferred tax assets and liabilities are measured on an undiscounted basis at the tax rates that are expected to apply when the related asset is realised or liability is settled, based on tax rates and laws enacted or substantively enacted at the Statement of Financial Position date.

The carrying amount of deferred tax assets is reviewed at each Statement of Financial Position date. Deferred tax assets and liabilities are offset, only if a legally enforcement right exists to set off current tax assets against current tax liabilities, the deferred income taxes relate to the same taxation authority and that authority permits the Company to make a single net payment.

(h) Financial liabilities

Basic financial liabilities, including trade and other payables, bank loans, loans from fellow Group companies and preference shares that are classified as debt, are initially recognised at transaction price, unless the arrangement constitutes a financing transaction, where the debt instrument is measured at the present value of the future receipts discounted at a market rate of interest.

Debt instruments are subsequently carried at amortised cost, using the effective interest rate method.

Trade payables are obligations to pay for goods or services that have been acquired in the ordinary course of business from suppliers. Accounts payable are classified as current liabilities if payment is due within one year or less. If not, they are presented as non-current liabilities. Trade payables are recognised initially at transaction price and subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method.

Financial liabilities are derecognised when the liability is extinguished, that is when the contractual obligation is discharged, cancelled or expires.

(i) Dividend distributions

Dividend distributions to the Company's shareholders are recognised as a liability in the period in which the dividends are approved by the Company's shareholders.

(j) Cash flow statement

The Company, as a small company, has availed of the exemption for small companies available in FRS 102 "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland", and has not prepared a cash flow statement.

(k) Going concern

The parent company, if called upon, has pledged to continue to support the working capital requirements of the company for the foreseeable future and amounts due to related parties will not be called for payment until the company has sufficient resources to do so. On this basis the directors are of the opinion that the going concern basis is appropriate.

3 FOREIGN EXCHANGE LOSS/ (GAIN)

The Company recorded a foreign exchange loss of \$60 for the year ended 31 December 2022 (2021: \$407 gain).

The Company's ultimate controlling party is Bessel RE S.à.r.l., a company incorporated in Luxembourg.

Neither the directors, nor the Company secretary, their spouses or minor children, held any interests in the shares of the Company, its parent undertaking or any other group undertaking.

Mr. A. Pignataro owns indirectly 100% of Bessel RE S.à.r.l.

14 PRIOR YEAR ADJUSTMENT

During the year, the Directors identified that certain other taxes and related income items had been incorrectly presented in the 2021 financial statements. These matters have been rectified through prior year adjustments in the current financial statements. The corrections resulted in an increase in Retained earnings, Corporation tax and other income totaling \$8,693 with a corresponding reduction in other taxes payable by \$8,693.
